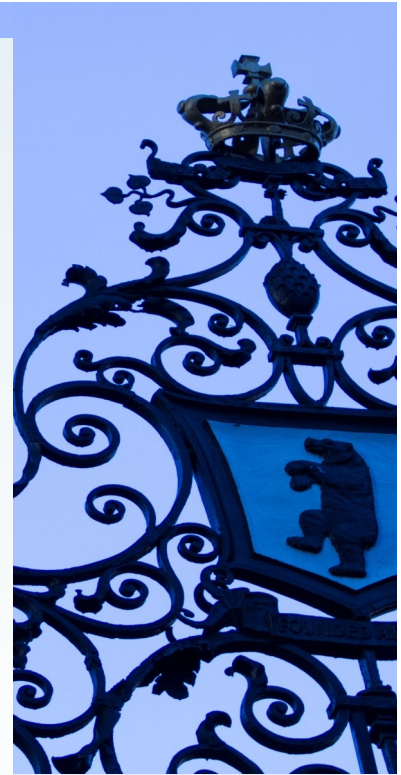
After Sage Advice, we have a few [news stories](#), including an overview of recent debates around facial recognition algorithms.

Featured Funders

Mid-career Fellowships

For today's column, we decided to break from our normal practice of profiling a single funder and turn our attention to a particular type of opportunity: mid-career fellowships. There are countless studies and articles looking into every aspect of the tenure process—who gets tenure, who doesn't, how to retain and support promising faculty. By contrast, there has been much less attention paid to faculty who have gotten tenure but not yet been promoted to full professor. When researchers do conduct studies on mid-career faculty, [they often find](#) that professional development can stagnate at that stage. Mid-career faculty are no longer carefully shielded by their senior colleagues from service responsibilities and can find it difficult to carve out time for research. They can also face [increased responsibilities at home](#), with aging parents and young children. Funding opportunities, too, are fewer; while a number of organizations offer early-career fellowships, dedicated mid-career opportunities are much less common. We've gathered a list below.

The National Science Foundation has recently announced a new [Mid-Career Advancement Award](#). "The MCA offers an opportunity for scientists and engineers at the Associate Professor rank (or equivalent) to substantively enhance and advance their research program through synergistic and mutually beneficial partnerships, typically at an institution other than their home institution. Projects that envision new insights on existing problems or identify new but related problems previously inaccessible without new methodology or expertise from other fields are encouraged. Partners from outside the PI's own subdiscipline or discipline are encouraged, but not required, to enhance interdisciplinary networking and convergence across science and engineering fields." **Deadline: February 1, 2021.**

The National Institutes of Health offer a "[Mid-Career Enhancement Awards to Integrate Basic Behavioral, Biomedical, and/or Social Scientific Processes](#)," which "invites applications from investigators who strive to expand their research trajectories through the acquisition of new knowledge and skills in the areas of basic psychological processes, sociological processes, and/or biomedical pathways—expertise that is beyond and enhances their current areas of expertise. The program will support career development experiences and a small-scale research project that will provide experienced investigators with the scientific competencies required to conduct independent research projects that more thoroughly investigate interrelationships among behavioral, biological, endocrine, epigenetic, immune, inflammatory, neurological, psychological, and/or social processes." **Deadline: March 17, annually.**

The James Marston Fitch Mid-Career Fellowship offers "Research grants of up to \$15,000...to mid-career professionals who have an academic background, professional experience and an established identity in one or more of the following fields: historic preservation, architecture, landscape architecture, urban design, environmental planning, architectural history and the decorative arts." **Deadline: TBA**

"**The Psychonomic Society Mid-Career Award** is given for exceptional contributions to the field of experimental and cognitive psychology and related areas by an individual who is currently in the middle of their career. The purpose is to raise the visibility of our science and of our very best mid-career scientists to the field, the awardees' institutions, the press, and the community at large. Many universities are carefully scrutinizing departments and programs in deciding upon the deployment of limited resources, and among the most important criteria are those that indicate academic and scientific quality." **Deadline: TBA. Funding: \$2,500**

Sage Advice

Updates from the NSF and NIH Virtual Conferences

Over the last two months, we've been busy watching the [NSF](#) and [NIH](#) virtual conferences online. You can check out the slides and presentations online. We've gathered together a few key updates below.

From the NSF. The NSF is tightening its rules on post-award disclosures. If an Authorized Organizational Representative (AOR) discovers that a PI or Co-PI has failed to disclose any current or in-kind support during the application, the AOR must submit a detailed report within 30 days to the NSF.

Relatedly, **if a PI's or a Co-PI's support has changed since the award was made or since they submitted an annual report, they must notify the NSF of that change.** As part of the process of keeping the NSF informed, awardees must also include a revised Current and Pending document with their Research Performance Progress Report (RPPR) as part of an annual notification to the NSF.

There are a lot logistical changes coming to the NSF as well.

The RPPR's format has changed, as of October 5, 2020.

The Revised PAPPG will be released in Spring 2021 and take effect in October 2021.

The transition from Fastlane to Research.gov is proceeding but will be incremental. You should expect some funding opportunities to require the use of Research.gov

The BIO Directorate now requires research.gov for all solicitations without deadlines.

The NSF recently issued [a demo site](#) for Research.gov.

From the NIH. Like the NSF, the NIH stressed the importance of PIs reporting all research activities, whether domestic or foreign. As they noted, openness and transparency enable productive collaboration and help ensure appropriate disclosure of potential conflicts of interest and commitment. They also observed that failure by some researchers at NIH-funded institutions to disclose substantial contributions of resources from other organizations, including foreign governments, threatens to distort decisions about the appropriate use of NIH funds.

They've made a few changes to their forms to reflect their emphasis on transparency. For the **Biosketch**, they've updated the instructions for Section B and its title to clarify that they are requesting details on **all** positions and scientific appointments, foreign and domestic. They have also removed Section D: Research Support, which duplicates information provided in Other Support. As a note, performance will remain in Section D for fellowship Biosketch. All research support information is now consolidated in the Other Support section of the application.

Speaking of which, the NIH is currently developing a template for the **Other Support** section that is similar to the one used in the NSF. Future updates will clarify:

Definition of gift: Gifts are resources provided where there is no expectation of anything (e.g. time, services, specific research activities, money, etc.) in return.

Expectations for reporting in-kind resources: in-kind contributions, e.g. office/laboratory space, equipment, supplies, employees, students. If the time commitment or dollar value of the in-kind contribution is not readily ascertainable, the recipient must provide reasonable estimates.

The NIH also noted that institutions are required to submit copies of foreign contracts and awards for all foreign activities and resources that are reported in Other Support. If they are not in English, recipients must provide translated copies.

Timeline: In Jan 2021 the NIH will start requiring the use of updated form templates. Finally, later in 2021/2022, the NIH will begin integrating Other Support templates into ScienCV.

Europe ramps up defense R&D

“European governments slashed defense budgets in the 1990s, believing the danger of major conflict in Europe had ended with the Cold War. “It was a

bit of a paradox, because of course we had the Balkan wars,” says Zdzisław Krasnodębski, a member of the European Parliament for Poland's governing Law and Justice Party who steered the EDF through Parliament. But recent events—particularly Russia's annexation of Crimea in 2014 and the subsequent war in Ukraine—have changed many minds, he says.” <<more>>

The ethical questions that haunt facial-recognition research

“In September 2019, four researchers wrote to the publisher Wiley to “respectfully ask” that it immediately retract a scientific paper. The study, published in 2018, had trained algorithms to distinguish faces of Uyghur people, a predominantly Muslim minority ethnic group in China, from those of Korean and Tibetan ethnicity.

“China had already been internationally condemned for its heavy surveillance and mass detentions of Uyghurs in camps in the northwestern province of Xinjiang — which the government says are re-education centres aimed at quelling a terrorist movement. According to media reports, authorities in Xinjiang have used surveillance cameras equipped with software attuned to Uyghur faces.

“As a result, many researchers found it disturbing that academics had tried to build such algorithms — and that a US journal had published a research paper on the topic.” <<more>>

In Congress, Becerra served on a House of Representatives committee that oversaw Medicare and Medicaid. As California attorney general, he has led efforts to defend the Affordable Care Act and women's reproductive rights.” <<more>>
