Featured Funder: The Council of American Overseas Research Centers (CAORC)

[The Council of American Overseas Research Centers \(CAORC\)](#) is a consortium of 16 independent, non-profit organizations (ORCs) that promote “advanced research, particularly in the humanities and social sciences, with a focus on the conservation and recording of cultural heritage and the understanding and interpretation of modern societies.” The centers are a great opportunity for American faculty, students, and independent scholars to meet research-related travel needs and to “carry out research vital to our understanding of and intersection with other cultures.” Below, we highlight upcoming fellowship and grant opportunities through CAORC with deadlines in the coming three months, so don't miss these time-sensitive opportunities! - ⇒ [Research Fellowships](#): “Support two to six months of research in Sri Lanka by US citizens who already hold a PhD or the equivalent at the time they begin their fellowship tenure. Both scholars with little or no experience in Sri Lanka as well as specialists are encouraged to apply.” | **Funding**: \$3,700/month, for a period of two to six months; **Deadline**: *December 1, 2024*
- ⇒ [Lydie T. Shufro Summer Research Fellowship](#): “Fellowships are open to students and scholars in Near Eastern studies from prehistory through the Ottoman period, including the fields of archaeology, anthropology, art history, biblical studies, epigraphy, historical geography, history, language, literature, philology, religion, and related disciplines.” “This Fellowship is for a residential period between June 1, 2026 and August 31, 2026. Residency at the Institute in Jerusalem is required and no exceptions can be granted.” **Funding**: \$3,000 award for 1 month. Room and half-board at the Institute is \$1,500 per month, and the remainder is a stipend; **Deadline**: *December 3, 2024*
- ⇒ [Multi-Country Research Fellowship](#): “The Multi-Country Research Fellowship enables US scholars to carry out transnational research in countries across the network of Overseas Research Centers as well as other countries. The fellowship supports advanced research in the humanities, social sciences, and allied natural sciences for US doctoral candidates, who are ‘all but dissertation’ and scholars who have earned their PhD or a terminal degree. Applicants are eligible to apply as individuals or as teams. Scholars must carry out research in two or more countries outside the US, at least one of which must host a participating Overseas Research Center...” | **Funding**: \$12,600; **Deadline**: *December 5, 2024*
- ⇒ [Short-Term Research Grant for Postdoctoral, Adjunct Faculty and Independent Scholars](#): “This grant is open to U.S. citizen postdoctoral, adjunct, community college, HBCU/MSI faculty, and visiting or independent scholars whose access to institutional funding for research travel may be limited. For these scholars, ARCE will offer a short-term travel grant designed to support research travel to Egypt. Minimum stay is three weeks; maximum stay is six weeks. During this period the grantee will conduct research pertaining to a new or ongoing research project.” | **Funding**: One \$2,640 grant plus round trip airfare; **Deadline**: *January 5, 2025*
- ⇒ [Fellowships for US Scholars](#): “The annual U.S. research fellowship competition for research that will contribute to Palestinian studies. Applicants must be doctoral students or scholars who have earned their PhD and must be U.S. citizens.” | **Funding**: up to \$25,000; **Deadline**: *January 6, 2025*
- ⇒ [CAORC-Neh Research Fellowship](#): “The CAORC - National Endowment for the Humanities Research Fellowship provides the opportunity for scholars to carry out advanced research in the humanities and to spend significant time in one country with an Overseas Research Centers as a base. Applicants must already hold their PhD or terminal degree, or have completed all requirements, except for the actual conferral of the degree, by the application deadline. Applicants must be US citizens or foreign national scholars who have been resident in the US for at least three years immediately preceding the application deadline...” | **Funding**: \$5,000 per month for four to six consecutive months; **Deadline**: *January 15, 2025*
- ⇒ [Fellowships for US Scholars](#): “U.S. citizens who are either current graduate students or post graduate scholars as well as team submissions are welcome, though all team members must meet the eligibility criteria. This fellowship enables scholars to travel and complete research on Yemen in any academic discipline. Travel must be carried out outside of the U.S. and Yemen.” | **Funding**: \$5,000; **Deadline**: *February 11th, 2025*

Sage Advice: Changes Coming for NIH Applications and Review Processes in 2025

NIH is implementing a number of changes to its submission, reporting, and review systems in 2025. These changes include a simplified framework for review, the launch of FORMS I application instructions, and the release of common forms for the biosketch and current and pending (other) support.

NIH has created a [central page for updates](#), which you'll want to bookmark, but, for your convenience, we provide a summary below of the major changes, and a timeline for implementation.

Required for Due Dates on or after January 25, 2025

[Simplified Review Framework for Most Research Project Grants \(RPGs\)](#)

NIH is launching a simplified peer review framework, beginning January 25, 2025. The goal is to reduce complexity for reviewers and to mitigate the effect of reputational bias. The simplified framework keeps in place the five regulatory criteria you're already familiar with (Significance, Investigators, Innovation, Approach, Environment), but condenses them into three "factors." All three factors will be considered in review; two will receive numerical scores and the third will be evaluated as either sufficient or not sufficient:

- ⇒ Factor 1: Importance of the Research (Significance, Innovation), scored 1-9, where 1 is best
- ⇒ Factor 2: Rigor and Feasibility (Approach), scored 1-9, where 1 is best
- ⇒ Factor 3: Expertise and Resources (Investigator, Environment), to be evaluated as either sufficient for the proposed research or not (in which case reviewers must provide an explanation)

The new framework applies to peer review of most research project applications, including the R01, R03, R15, and R21 activity codes. It does NOT apply to the R35 activity code. (Activity codes that deviate from the standard Research Project Grant review criteria were excluded.)

Required for Due Dates on or after May 25, 2025

[Common Forms for Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending \(Other\) Support](#)

NIH, NSF, and other Federal agencies are adopting common forms for the Biographical Sketch and the Current and Pending (Other) Support documents in 2025. The intent is to standardize disclosure requirements.

NSF has already started to use a version of the Common Forms via SciENcv. NIH will use SciENcv as well. While these are "common forms," they will vary a little bit from agency to agency. So, if you're applying to NIH, you won't be able to use the NSF Common Form Biosketch; you'll need to use the NIH version.

NIH will continue to collect the three data elements that have been specific to their biosketches (Personal Statement, Contributions to Science, and Honors) – but these elements will be collected outside the new Biosketch Common Form (in the same way that the Synergistic Activities for NSF are no longer collected in their Biosketch, but in a separate attachment).

What you can do now to prepare

Sign up for [SciENcv](#). You will use this platform to generate your NIH biosketch and Current and Pending (Other) Support Documents. NSF has required SciENcv for a while now, so NSF researchers, you have a head start!

Sign up for an [ORCID](#) ID, which will be required for all senior/key personnel listed on applications on or after May 25, 2025.
