Featured Funder: The Institute for Advanced Study (IAS)

The Institute for Advanced Study (IAS) is a renowned research institution founded in 1930 and located in Princeton, New Jersey. The IAS provides a highly supportive and collaborative environment for scholars to pursue their research and offers state-of-the-art research facilities and resources to support scholars' work. The IAS is unique in its commitment to providing scholars with a stimulating environment to pursue their research without the pressures of teaching or administrative duties, which often takes the form of visiting scholar fellowships with salary replacement and housing opportunities. The IAS is organized by four schools: historical studies, mathematics, natural sciences, and social science:

School of Historical Studies: The School of Historical Studies supports “scholarship in all fields of historical research but is concerned principally with the history of western, near eastern and Asian civilizations, with particular emphasis upon the Greek and Roman world, the history of Europe (medieval, early modern, and modern), the Islamic world, East Asian studies, art history, history of science, and musicology.”

- ⇒ **Duration:** September 22 – December 19, 2025 for Term 1 & January 12 – April 10, 2026 for Term II

School of Mathematics: “The IAS School of Mathematics welcomes applications from mathematicians and theoretical computer scientists at all career levels, and strongly encourages applications from women, minorities, and mid-career scientists (5-15 years from Ph.D.). Competitive salaries, on-campus housing, and other resources are available for periods of 2-11 months for researchers in all mathematical subject areas.”

- ⇒ **Application Deadline:** December 1, 2024
- ⇒ **Duration:** Varies and depends on membership type (i.e post-doctoral membership, mid-senior career level membership, etc.)

School of Natural Sciences: The School of Natural Sciences offers positions at “a postdoctoral or higher level in the areas of theoretical astrophysics, biology, cosmology, mathematical physics, quantum field theory, particle phenomenology, string theory and quantum gravity. Members are selected on their ability to conduct independent research and are free to work full-time on problems in which they are interested.” Fellowship opportunities range from visiting professorships to long-term fellowships of five years and sabbaticals.

School of Social Science: The mission of the School of Social Science is “devoted to critical approaches to social research, both theoretical and empirical, and featuring multidisciplinary, multi-method and international perspectives. Each year the School invites approximately twenty scholars working on a variety of topics to pursue their individual research within a rich context of intellectual discussion and exchange. Scholars are drawn from across the fields of social science and occasionally from the humanities as well.” The theme for the 2025-2026 academic year is “[Digital \(In\)Equality](#),” though applications are not required to relate to the theme.

Sage Advice: Office of Research Integrity’s “Applying for a Grant? Don’t Take Shortcuts”

The process of preparing a federal grant application can be both time-consuming and overwhelming at times. Under the pressure of deadlines, it's easy to become solely focused on crafting a compelling narrative. However, a successful grant application requires much more than just a well-written story as important as the narrative may be. Ensuring compliance with federal regulations, coordinating supplementary materials, and addressing potential challenges are all critical components of the application process but are often the components that are left until the very end. IFSR can support all components of federal grant applications, and in our upcoming Sage Advice publications, we'll explore the unique challenges that may come with federal grant writing and application preparation. To kick things off, we're sharing insights from the Office of Research Integrity on how to maintain research integrity when under pressure throughout the federal grant application process.

All researchers understand the pressure of submitting a grant application on time. This pressure may lead some to take shortcuts that potentially lead to research misconduct. Here are some things you can do to maintain research integrity in your grant application:
