Featured Funder

Simons Foundation

"The Simons Foundation's mission is to advance the frontiers of research in mathematics and the basic sciences." Their funding programs focus on Mathematics and Physical Sciences, Life Sciences, Autism Research, and, most recently, computational science at an internal institute here in New York City.

Mathematics and Physical Sciences (MPS) currently offers the most opportunities:

- Simons Symposia, deadline October 31, 2018
- Collaboration Grants for Mathematicians, deadline January 31, 2019
- Targeted Grants in MPS, rolling deadline
- Simons Collaborations in MPS, last deadline October 3, 2018, scheduled to reopen in September, 2019
- Targeted Grants to Institutes program, last deadline September 27, 2018, scheduled to reopen Summer, 2019
- Simons Fellows in Theoretical Physics, last deadline September 27, 2018, scheduled to reopen Summer, 2019
- Simons Fellows in Mathematics, last deadline September 27, 2018, scheduled to reopen Summer, 2019

Programs in the Life Sciences have historically gone to support early career scientists. The Foundation is currently accepting proposals for the Simons Early Career Investigator in Marine Microbial Ecology and Evolution Awards, deadline November 6, 2018, although reference letters are due October 30, 2018. Their Postdoctoral Fellowships in Origins of Life and Marine Microbial Ecology are currently closed.

The Simons Autism Research Institute (SFARI) has in the past sought researchers to work on highly specific projects, almost all of which are now closed. The Foundation now offers funding to support SPARK, "a SFARI initiative intended to recruit, engage and retain a community of 50,000 individuals with autism, and their family members, in the United States." Simons will provide "funding of up to \$200,000/year for a maximum of three years" to clinical sites recruiting SPARK participants. Deadline is November 30, 2018.

In addition to grant funding, The Simons Foundation launched the Flatiron Institute in 2016 to "conduct scientific research in-house, supporting teams of top computational scientists. The mission of the Flatiron Institute is to advance scientific research through computational methods, including data analysis, modeling and simulation." It hosts four computational centers for Astrophysics, Biology, Mathematics, and Quantum Physic, as well as a Scientific Computing Core for computational infrastructure at the Foundation and for the computational scientific community.

Other Simons Foundation projects support public engagement with science through Science Sandbox, Quanta Magazine, public lectures in New York City, and K-12 educator programs.

Sage Advice for Competitive Proposals

Mentorship Advice from the Office of Research Integrity

The U.S. Health and Human Services Office of Research Integrity has recently begun producing posters to promote responsible conduct in research. They will be rolling out several, each with a different focus area, over the next few months. Some of them, like this one on mentorship, have sage advice aimed, as you might expect, toward ensuring research integrity.

RESPECTFUL

Demonstrates respect for all laboratory members, which reduces fear and unhealthy competitiveness.



SUPPORTIVE

Supports mentees by acknowledging accomplishments and challenging mentees to develop skills that advance their careers.

AVAILABLE

Establishes open and responsive communication with mentees, which promotes research integrity and discourages questionable research practices.



PREPARED

Anticipates the needs of mentees and is prepared to provide assistance and guidance.



HONEST

Sets high standards for honest reporting of data, regardless of whether the data supports the desired outcome.

Columbia is Offering All of Us a New Grants Search Tool

Register for a Pivot account through Columbia From Stephanie Scott of CU Sponsored Projects Administration (SPA)

Last month the Augustus C. Long Health Sciences Library (HSL) and SPA announced the availability of a new tool called Pivot, which provides immediate access to funding opportunities targeted for you. Start using Pivot at: https://pivot.cos.com/. To get the most out of Pivot, users should:

- Create a Pivot Account, using your Columbia University email address. (A Pivot PowerPoint training presentation showing you how to create an account and claim your profile can be found on the Barnard website here. Don't make the mistake this newsletter writer did of creating your Pivot account BEFORE you set up forwarding of your CU email address.)
- After creating an account, claim and update your profile. Keeping your profile up to date enables better funding opportunity matching.
- Search, save and share funding searches.
 Having a Pivot account allows you to save your searches and create email alerts of new opportunities in your area of interest.
- Collaborate with others. You can search for potential collaborators within Columbia University, or outside the institution, by conducting a profile search.
- Take advantage of the training videos and other training materials offered by Pivot.

HSL and SPA are currently working on a schedule of speaking events to demonstrate Pivot in the coming months. Stay tuned for more information. If you have questions, please feel free to reach us via HSL.

NEW RPPR SUBMISSION PROCEDURES FOR INCLUSION ENROLLMENT DATA

Who's Affected? All investigators submitting RPPR files with 2018 inclusion enrollment updates submitted since the June 9th launch of the Human Subjects System (HSS).

What's Changed? There is now a two-step submission process for inclusion enrollment data updates made during the RPPR process – one submission via ASSIST for the inclusion data and a separate submission for the full RPPR file. Investigators will enter their inclusion enrollment updates via ASSIST in the Human Subjects and Clinical Trial (HSCT) form. When completed, they need to update the ASSIST file status to "Ready for Submission" and route to their Signing Official (SO) for submission prior to the submission of their full RPPR file.

Research Fellowship for Experienced Researchers <u>Deadline:</u> Rolling

"Submit an application if you are a researcher from abroad with above average qualifications, completed your doctorate less than twelve years ago, already have your own research profile and are working at least at the level of Assistant Professor or Junior Research Group Leader or have a record of several years of independent academic work. A Humboldt Research Fellowship for experienced researchers allows you to carry out long-term research (6-18 months) in Germany. Applicants choose their own topic of research and their academic host. The fellowship is flexible and can be divided up into as many as three stays within three years. Scientists and scholars of all nationalities and disciplines may apply to the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation online at any time." <<more>>

Humboldt Foundation

Research Fellowship for Postdoctoral Researchers <u>Deadline:</u> Rolling

"Submit an application if you are a researcher from abroad with above average qualifications, at the beginning of your academic career and only completed your doctorate in the last four years. A Humboldt Research Fellowship for postdoctoral researchers allows you to carry out long-term research (6-24 months) in Germany. Applicants choose their own topic of research and their academic host. Scientists and scholars of all nationalities and disciplines may apply to the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation online at any time." <<more>>

Manhattanville College Earhart Foundation Fellowship Deadline: Rolling

"To support professionals in the social sciences and humanities, including economics, international affairs, government/politics, and philosophy; applications should be submitted no less than120 days before commencement of project work period." <<more>>

Pulitzer Center Travel Grants

Deadline: Rolling

"The Pulitzer Center on Crisis Reporting provides travel grants to cover hard costs associated with upcoming travel for an international reporting project. Our goal is to facilitate reporting from outside the United States. We encourage grantees from diverse backgrounds to apply. We support projects across all media platforms and encourage ones that combine print, photography, radio, and video. While the vast majority of our grants go towards international projects, currently we are accepting proposals on topics that may have a domestic focus: mass incarceration and gun violence. In both cases we have an interest in stories with a domestic focus, or a purely international angle, or projects that draw comparisons between the United States and other countries." <<more>>

ARTS AND HUMANITIES

New York Foundation for the Arts NYSCA/NYFA Artists' Fellowships

<u>Deadline</u>: January 23, 2019 "NYSCA/NYFA Artist Fellowships, awarded in fifteen different disciplines over a three-year

period, are \$7,000 cash awards made to individual originating artists living and working in the state of New York for unrestricted use. These fellowships are not project grants but are intended to fund an artist's vision or voice, regardless of the level of his or her artistic development. The 2019 categories are: Architecture/Environmental Structures/ Design; Choreography; Music/Sound; Photography; and Playwriting/Screenwriting." <<more>

Virginia Museum of History and Culture Research Fellowships

Deadline: January 25, 2019

"To promote the interpretation of Virginia history and access to its collections, the Virginia Historical Society, funded by a matching grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation and gifts from individuals, offers fellowships of up to three weeks a year.... There are three general categories of fellowships: Andrew W. Mellon Research Fellowships cover the broad sweep of Virginia and American history, for example, supporting research on political, constitutional, religious, African American, military, and social issues. The Betty Sams Christian Fellowships in business history cover studies in economic history, trade, industrial and commercial subjects, and labor relations. The Frances Lewis Fellowships in Gender and Women's Studies support work in gender roles and the history of women." <<more>>

Princeton University Library Library Research Grants

Deadline: January 31, 2019

"Each year, the Friends of the Princeton University Library offer short-term Library Research Grants to promote scholarly use of the research collections. Library Research Grants are offered in a number of programs, including the study of Hellenic cultures, children's books, Portuguese-speaking cultures, and the Age of Revolution and the Enlightenment in the Atlantic World. These Library Research Grants are meant to help defray expenses incurred in traveling to and residing in Princeton during the

tenure of the grant. The length of the grant will depend on the applicant's research proposal, but is ordinarily up to one month." <<more>>

Barbara Demming Memorial Fund Artist Grants

Deadline: January 31, 2019

"Small artist support grants (\$500 - \$1500) to individual feminist women in the arts." ... "We are interested in [f]unding projects which you have begun or which are well underway, and for which you have substantial work to show. We request that the majority of your submitted materials be related to and part of this project." <<more>>

University of London, School of Advanced Study Institute/Consortium Fellowships Deadline: Varies by institute

"The nine institutes within the School of Advanced Study offer a number of visiting research fellowships in their specialist subject areas. The Institutes offer a number of visiting and research fellowships in legal studies, classical studies, Commonwealth studies, English studies, historical research, Latin American studies, modern languages, philosophy, and the classical tradition of Europe. The fellowships vary in length and in the stipend amounts. The application deadlines vary between the Institutes."

"The School lies at the heart of a global research community, acting both as a national hub for advanced level research into the humanities and social sciences and an international meeting point and research resource for scholars from all over the world. Each year the School welcomes around 140 visiting research fellows who benefit from its unique research resources and multidisciplinary scholarly community." <<more>>>

American Academy of Religion Individual and Collaborative Grants Deadline: Rolling

"To fulfill its commitment to advance research in religion, the AAR each year grants awards to support projects proposed by AAR members and selected by the AAR Research Grants Jury. These projects can be either collaborative or individual. These grants provide support for important aspects of research such as travel to archives and libraries and field work as well as networking, communication, and small research conferences."

Tools and Trades History Society Salaman Awards

Deadline: Rolling

"Funds are available to a limit, in any one calendar year, of £2000 in the form of Grants towards the cost of research projects proposed to be undertaken. However, it would be very exceptional for the entire sum to be granted/ awarded to a single project or piece of research. Applications will be considered from any person or group, whether members of the Tools and Trades History Society or not. Proposed projects and completed work submitted for consideration will be assessed by the Executive Trustees regarding: Originality of the work and the extent to which it advances the Society's objective. Suitability for publication, either as written material or as a visual/aural record, under the auspices of the Society, or elsewhere with the acknowledgement of the Society's assistance.... Potential Applicants should be aware that submissions received in the early part of the year will be more likely of success in getting a Grant/Award that year, than those which arrive later, when other budgetary processes may have imposed funding constraints." <<more>>

SOCIAL SCIENCE

National Science Foundation Decision, Risk and Management Sciences

Deadline: January 18, 2019

"The Decision, Risk and Management Sciences program supports scientific research directed at increasing the understanding and effectiveness of decision making by individuals, groups, organizations, and society. Disciplinary and interdisciplinary research, doctoral dissertation research improvement grants (DDRIGs), and workshops are funded in the areas of judgment and decision making; decision analysis and decision aids; risk analysis, perception, and communication; societal and public policy decision making; management science and organizational design." <<more>

National Science Foundation Economics

Deadline: January 18, 2019

"The Economics program supports research designed to improve the understanding of the processes and institutions of the U.S. economy and of the world system of which it is a part. This program also strengthens both empirical and theoretical economic analysis as well as the methods for rigorous research on economic behavior. It supports research in almost every area of economics, including econometrics, economic history, environmental economics, finance, industrial organization, international economics, labor economics, macroeconomics, mathematical economics, and public finance. The Economics program welcomes proposals for individual or multi-investigator research projects, doctoral dissertation improvement awards, conferences, symposia, experimental research, data collection and dissemination, computer equipment and other instrumentation, and research experience for undergraduates. The program places a high priority on interdisciplinary research." <<more>>

The Classical Association of the Middle West and South

Excavation/Field School Award <u>Deadline</u>: January 30, 2019

"ACL wants to help our members enhance their teaching by encouraging them to travel, take courses, attend professional meetings, and engage in professional development that is concerned with Latin, Greek and the ancient world where these languages prevailed." "ACL members at all levels of teaching are eligible to apply. Must be a

member of ACL for at least 3 consecutive years, including this current year and the two preceding years. ACL scholarship recipients may apply every 4 years" "Funded Activities: registration, room, board and travel for attendance at ACL Institute; purchase of materials from the ACL Teaching Materials and Resource Center; Expenses connected with enrollment in classes required for Latin Certification; *Bona fide* summer study programs at home or abroad." <<more>

Searle Freedom Trust

Grants in Public Policy

Deadline: Rolling

"Recognizing that good policymaking relies on the availability of high-quality research, the foundation invests primarily in scholarship that results in the publication of books, journal articles, and policy papers. Funding is typically provided in the form of research grants, fellowships, and other types of targeted project support. The Searle Freedom Trust also provides funding for public interest litigation and supports outreach to the public through a variety of forums, including sponsorship of research conferences and seminars, film and journalism projects, and new media initiatives. With the foundation's assistance, university and think tank scholars investigate a wide range of issues, including: · Tax and budget policy · Costbenefit analysis of regulatory practices and proposals · The workings of the legal system · Environmental policy · Social welfare reform · K-12 and higher education policy" <<more>>

Baylor Library Dowdy Research Grant

<u>Deadline</u>: Rolling "BCPM seeks to assist researchers through the John and JD Dowdy Memorial Congressional Research Endowed Fund which provides financial support for on-campus work in the library's congressional collections." <<more>>>

LANGUAGE AND AREA STUDIES

Center for Middle Eastern Studies at Harvard Univeristy Visiting Researcher Program

Deadline: January 16, 2018

"In the interest of promoting scholarly research on all aspects of Middle Eastern and Islamic studies, the Center for Middle Eastern Studies appoints a small number of Visiting Researchers each academic year. Their work covers a wide range of fields, including anthropology, religion, history, political science, economics, and literature. The Visiting Researchers contribute to a lively community at CMES that encourages interdisciplinary contact." <<more>>

Hutchins Center for African and African American Research at Harvard University Du Bois Research Institute Fellowship

Deadline: January 17, 2019 "The Fellows Program is at the heart of the activities of the W. E. B. Du Bois Research Institute. Started in 1975 as the W. E. B. Du Bois Institute for African and African American Research, the Institute has annually appointed scholars who conduct individual research for a period of one to two semesters in a wide variety of fields related to African and African American Studies." <<more>

Japanese Foundation of New York Grant for Japanese Studies

Deadline: Rolling

"This grant aims to support projects that will enhance further understanding of Japan through academic exploration (there is a separate JFNY Grant for Arts and Culture). Such projects generally take the form of conferences, colloquia, symposia, presentations, and lectures within the United States. Successful projects may be granted up to \$5,000. Priority will be given to those projects that have secured additional funding from sources other than the Japan Foundation." <<more>

Japanese Foundation of New York Grant for Art and Culture

Deadline: Rolling

"This grant aims to support projects that will further understanding of Japanese arts and culture. Successful projects may be granted up to \$5,000. Priority will be given to those projects that have secured additional funding from sources other than the Japan Foundation." <<more>>>

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics)

National Science Foundation Opportunities for Promoting Understanding through Synthesis (OPUS)

<u>Deadline</u>: November 19, 2018, August 5, 2019 "The OPUS program seeks to provide opportunities for mid- to later-career investigators to develop new understanding of science in the fields supported by the Division of Environmental Biology (DEB) through two tracks of synthesis activities.

OPUS: Mid-Career Synthesis. This track provides an opportunity for a mid-career researcher, defined as a candidate at the associate professor rank (or equivalent) to enable a new synthesis of their ongoing research. Synthesis is achieved by developing new research capabilities through collaboration with a mentor to enable new understanding of their research system and questions of interest. This track aims to provide mid-career scientists with new capabilities to enhance their productivity, improve their retention as scientists, and ensure a diverse scientific workforce that remains engaged in active research (including more women and minorities at high academic ranks). **OPUS: Core Research Synthesis. This track** provides an opportunity for an individual or a group of investigators to revisit and synthesize a significant body of their prior research in a way that will enable new understanding of their research system and questions of interest. This track would also be appropriate early enough in a career to produce unique, integrated insight useful both to the scientific community and to the development of the investigator's future career. All four clusters within the Division of Environmental Biology (Ecosystem Science, **Evolutionary Processes, Population and** Community Ecology, and Systematics and Biodiversity Science) encourage the submission of these proposals enabling researchers to expand understanding and develop new insights in their research." <<more>>

National Science Foundation Major Research Instrumentation

Deadline: January 22, 2019

"The Major Research Instrumentation (MRI) Program serves to increase access to multi-user scientific and engineering instrumentation for research and research training in our Nation's institutions of higher education and not-forprofit scientific/engineering research organizations. An MRI award supports the acquisition or development of a multi-user research instrument that is, in general, too costly and/or not appropriate for support through other NSF programs. MRI provides support to acquire critical research instrumentation without which advances in fundamental science and engineering research may not otherwise occur. MRI also provides support to develop next-generation research instruments that open new opportunities to advance the frontiers in science and engineering research. Additionally, an MRI award is expected to enhance research training of students who will become the next generation of instrument users, designers and builders." <<more>>

National Science Foundation Biological Anthropology

Deadline: January 22, 2019

"The Biological Anthropology Program supports basic research in areas related to human evolution and contemporary human biological variation. Research areas supported by the program include, but are not limited to, human genetic variation, human and nonhuman primate ecology and adaptability, human osteology and bone biology, human and nonhuman primate paleontology, functional anatomy, and primate socioecology. Grants supported in these areas are united by an underlying evolutionary framework, and often by a consideration of adaptation as a central theoretical theme. Proposals may also have a biocultural or bioarchaeological orientation. The program frequently serves as a bridge within NSF between the social and behavioral sciences and the natural and physical sciences, and

proposals commonly are jointly reviewed and funded with other programs." <<more>>

Simons Foundation Collaboration Grants for Mathematicians Deadline: January 31, 2019

"The goal of the program is to support the "mathematical marketplace" by substantially increasing collaborative contacts between mathematicians. The foundation will make a large number of collaboration grants to accomplished, active researchers in the United States who do not otherwise have access to funding that allows support for travel and visitors.... Awards will be based on the quality and significance of the applicant's previous research, as outlined in the Statement of Recent Work requirement below, and on the likely impact the collaboration grant will have on future research, both for the applicant and the applicant's graduate students and/or postdoctoral fellows." <<more>

National Science Foundation Energy, Power, Control, and Network Deadline: Rolling

"The Energy, Power, Control, and Networks (EPCN) Program supports innovative research in modeling, optimization, learning, adaptation, and control of networked multi-agent systems, higherlevel decision making, and dynamic resource allocation, as well as risk management in the presence of uncertainty, sub-system failures, and stochastic disturbances. EPCN also invests in novel machine learning algorithms and analysis, adaptive dynamic programming, brain-like networked architectures performing real-time learning, and neuromorphic engineering. EPCN's goal is to encourage research on emerging technologies and applications including energy, transportation, robotics, and biomedical devices & systems. EPCN also emphasizes electric power systems, including generation, transmission, storage, and integration of renewable energy sources into the grid; power electronics and drives; battery management systems; hybrid and electric vehicles; and understanding of the interplay of power systems with associated

regulatory & economic structures and with consumer behavior." <<more>>

National Science Foundation

Communications, Circuits, and Sensing-Systems Deadline: Rolling

"The Communications, Circuits, and Sensing-Systems (CCSS) Program supports innovative research in circuit and system hardware and signal processing techniques. CCSS also supports system and network architectures for communications and sensing to enable the next-generation cyberphysical systems (CPS) that leverage computation, communication, and sensing integrated with physical domains. CCSS invests in micro- and nanoelectromechanical systems (MEMS/NEMS), physical, chemical, and biological sensing systems, neurotechnologies, and communication & sensing circuits and systems. The goal is to create new complex and hybrid systems ranging from nano- to macro-scale with innovative engineering principles and solutions for a variety of applications including but not limited to healthcare, medicine, environmental and biological monitoring, communications, disaster mitigation, homeland security, intelligent transportation, manufacturing, energy, and smart buildings. CCSS encourages research proposals based on emerging technologies and applications for communications and sensing such as high-speed communications of terabits per second and beyond, sensing and imaging covering microwave to terahertz frequencies, personalized health monitoring and assistance, secured wireless connectivity and sensing for the Internet of Things, and dynamicdata-enabled autonomous systems through realtime sensing and learning." <<more>>

National Science Foundation Secure and Trustworthy Cyberspace (SaTC) Deadline: Rolling

"In today's increasingly networked, distributed, and asynchronous world, cybersecurity involves hardware, software, networks, data, people, and integration with the physical world. However, society's overwhelming reliance on this complex cyberspace has exposed its fragility and

vulnerabilities: corporations, agencies, national infrastructure and individuals have been victims of cyber-attacks. Achieving a truly secure cyberspace requires addressing both challenging scientific and engineering problems involving many components of a system, and vulnerabilities that arise from human behaviors and choices.
