Welcome back to the fall semester 2017. We hope you're looking forward to a new year and new opportunities to support your work.

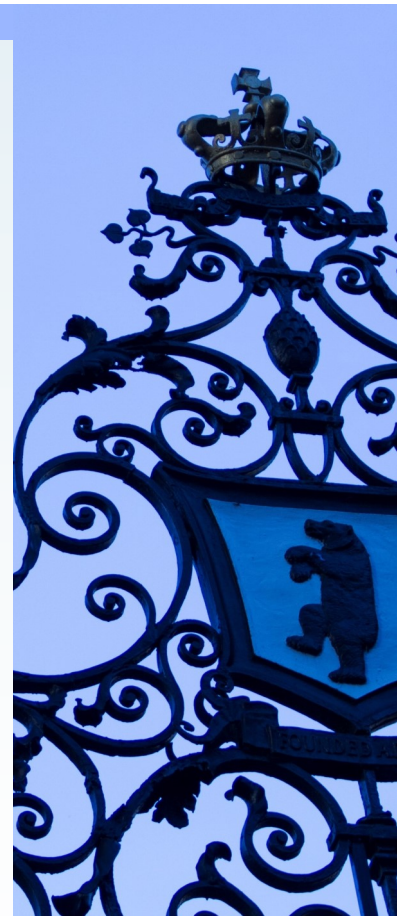

## Featured Funding Opportunity

### National Archives and Records Administration—National Historical Publications and Records Commission

“From Quill Pen to Computer”

Each year, Congress sets aside \$10 million for grants to be distributed by the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC), the grant-making arm of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA). NHPRC “supports a wide range of activities to preserve, publish, and encourage the use of documentary sources, created in every medium ranging from quill pen to computer, relating to the history of the United States.”

## Grants and Fellowship Opportunities

### General Interest and Cross Disciplinary

#### **The American Academy in Berlin—Berlin Prize**

Deadline: September 29, 2017

The Academy seeks to enrich transatlantic dialogue in the arts, humanities, and public policy through the development and communication of projects of the highest scholarly merit. For 2018-19, the Academy is also interested in considering projects that address the themes of migration and social integration, as well as questions of race in comparative perspective.

For all projects, the Academy asks that candidates explain the relevance of a stay in Berlin to the development of their work. Fellowships are typically awarded for an academic semester.

Bosch Fellowships in Public Policy may be awarded for shorter stays of six to eight weeks. Benefits include round-trip airfare, partial board, a \$5,000 monthly stipend, and accommodations at the Academy's lakeside Hans Arnhold Center in Berlin's Wannsee district. <<more>>

#### **National Endowment for the Humanities—Humanities Connections Grants**

Deadline: October 17, 2017

“The Humanities Connections grant program seeks to expand the role of the humanities in undergraduate education at two- and four-year institutions. Grants will support innovative curricular approaches that foster productive partnerships among humanities faculty and their counterparts in the social and natural sciences and in pre-service or professional programs (such as business, engineering, health sciences, law, computer science, and other technology-driven fields).” Grants are funded at two levels, planning <<more>> and implementation <<more>>.

#### **American Council of Learned Societies Luce/ACLS Program in Religion, Journalism & International Affairs**

Deadline: October 25, 2017

“The program is a two-part initiative designed to foster new connections between scholars and journalists covering international affairs by offering an interrelated set of awards:

programming grants for universities and fellowships for scholars in the humanities and social sciences who study religion in international contexts....

These fellowships support scholars in the humanities and related social sciences who are pursuing research on any aspect of religion in international contexts and who desire to connect their specialist knowledge with journalists and media practitioners. The ultimate goal of the research should be a significant piece of scholarly work by the applicant and concrete steps to engage journalistic and media audiences.”

### Arts and Humanities Funding

#### **Getty/ACLS Postdoctoral Fellowships in the History of Art**

Deadline: October 25, 2017 [↓](#)

“These fellowships are intended to support an academic year of research and/or writing by early career scholars for a project that will make a substantial and original contribution to the understanding of art and its history. The ultimate goal of the project should be a major piece of scholarly work by the applicant....

ACLS will award 10 fellowships, each with a salary-replacement stipend of \$60,000, plus \$5,000 for research and travel during the award period. The fellowships are portable and are tenable at the fellow's home institution, abroad, or at another appropriate site for the work proposed. Awards also will include a one-week residence at the Getty Research Institute following the fellowship period.” [<<more>>](#)

#### **Columbia School of Journalism – The J. Anthony Lukas Prize Project Awards**

Deadline: December 12, 2017

“The J. Anthony Lukas Work--in--Progress Award, in the amount of \$25,000, is given annually to aid in the completion of a significant work of nonfiction on a topic of American political or social concern. Recognizing that a nonfiction book based

on extensive original research often overtaxes the resources available to its author, the project envisions the award as a way of closing the gap between the time and money an author has and the time and money that finishing a book requires.” [<<more>>](#)

#### **Institute for Advanced Study, H. Allen Brooks Travelling Fellowship**

“The Society of Architectural Historians is accepting applications for the 2017 H. Allen Brooks Travelling Fellowship. The prestigious fellowship of \$50,000 will allow a recent graduate or emerging scholar to study by travel for one year. The fellowship is *not* for the purpose of doing research for a book or an advanced degree. Instead, the goals are to provide an opportunity for the recipient to see and experience architecture and landscapes firsthand, to think about his/her profession deeply, and to acquire knowledge useful for his/her future work and contribution to society.” The Fellowship is open to “an emerging scholar who was awarded a PhD or advanced terminal degree in 2016, 2015, 2014, 2013 or 2012 in a field related to the built environment.”

#### **National Council of Teachers of English 2017 Research Foundation Teacher Grant Program**

“Applicants should be full-time classroom teachers at the time of proposal submission and for the length of the grant. Proposals are invited from teachers of children and youth at any level, birth through grade 12. Teachers in urban, suburban, and rural settings are eligible. **Applicants must be current members of NCTE.**

#### **Council on Foreign Relations International Affairs Fellowship for Tenured International Relations Scholars**

Deadline: October 31, 2017

The Council on Foreign Relations “offers tenured international relations professors hands-on and practical experience in the foreign policymaking field by placing selected fellows in U.S. government agencies or at international government organizations for a period of twelve months.... The fellowship helps close the gap between research and practice on peace and security as well as enrich the teaching and scholarship of tenured academics by enabling selected fellows to become practitioners. The program also benefits policymakers by exposing them to critical scholarly research relevant to the foreign policy and national security issues facing the United States and the world community.”

#### **Wenner-Gren Foundation Post-Ph.D. Research Grants**

“Post-Ph.D. Research Grants are awarded to individuals holding a Ph.D. or equivalent degree to support individual research projects. The program contributes to the Foundation's overall mission to support basic research in anthropology and to ensure that the discipline continues to be a source of vibrant and significant work that furthers our understanding of humanity's cultural and biological origins, development, and variation. The Foundation supports research that demonstrates a clear link to anthropological theory and debates,

and promises to make a solid contribution to advancing these ideas. There is no preference for any methodology, research location, or subfield. The Foundation particularly welcomes proposals that employ a comparative perspective, can generate innovative approaches or ideas, and/or integrate two or more subfields.” <<more>>

“In its sixth year, The Henry Luce Foundation/ACLS Program in China Studies seeks to maintain the vitality of China Studies in North America through fellowships and grants designed primarily for scholars early in their careers. Studies on and in China have developed over the last 30 years in the United States and Canada into a robust field, but current conditions pose daunting problems, especially for scholars just before and just after the dissertation. To address this situation, the program offers three competitions.”

### Asian Cultural Council – Individual Guidelines

Deadline: December 1, 2017

Council funding supports artists, arts or humanities professionals, scholars, or graduate/post-graduate students in a related field. Proposed projects must take place outside one's home country, in either the United States or Asia. "...Fellowship grants are process-oriented, not product-oriented. They are intended for exploration, not exhibition." The majority of ACC's grants are awarded after its May board meeting. Projects should begin no earlier than June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018. ### STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) Funding

### National Science Foundation Chemical Synthesis Program

Deadline: October 2, 2017

"The Chemical Synthesis Program supports experimental and computational research on the development of new and efficient synthetic methodologies and on the synthesis of complex and/or challenging chemical structures. Typical synthetic targets include novel structures (including natural products and biomolecules), molecules and structures displaying unique properties, or substances that provide pathways to discover and elucidate new phenomena. Examples of supported research areas include the development of innovative reagents, discovery of new synthetic methods, and synthesis of novel organic, organometallic, and inorganic structures. Research in this program will generate fundamental new knowledge of chemical synthesis, but also enable new discoveries and the development of transformative technologies in related fields.

### American Chemical Society Undergraduate Research Grants

Deadline: October 20, 2017

"The goals of the American Chemical Society Petroleum Research Fund are:

- To support fundamental research in the petroleum field, and
- To develop the next generation of engineers and scientists through support of advanced scientific education.

The Undergraduate Research (UR) grants program supports the research programs of established scientists and engineers at non-doctoral departments and provides financial support for students at those institutions to become involved in advanced research activities, in preparation for continued study in graduate school or employment." ### The NIH Blueprint for Neuroscience Research

Deadline for Letter of Intent: November 7, 2017

"The NIH Blueprint for Neuroscience Research is a collaborative framework through which 14 NIH Institutes, Centers and Offices jointly support neuroscience-related research, with the aim of accelerating discoveries and reducing the burden of nervous system disorders..." The goal is to "transform our understanding of how dynamic interactions among multiple cell types involved in neuroimmune interactions (e.g., neurons, glia cells, neurovascular units, or other neuroimmune components) mediate the transition from normal central nervous system (CNS) function to disorder conditions....With this FOA, we encourage projects that combine diverse expertise and use innovative approaches to address these questions at the molecular, cellular, and circuitry levels. The outcomes of this research will provide an integrated view of the dynamic changes among multiple neuroimmune components and how they contribute to the onset and progression of CNS disorders." **NSF Directorate for Biological Sciences (BIO)  
Postdoctoral Research Fellowships**

Deadline: November 7, 2017

“To recent recipients of the doctoral degree for research and training in *selected* areas supported by BIO and with special goals for human resource development in biology. The fellowships encourage independence at an early stage of the research career to permit Fellows to pursue their research and training goals in the most appropriate research locations regardless of the availability of funding for the Fellows at that site. For FY 2015 and beyond, these BIO programs are (1) Broadening Participation of Groups Underrepresented in Biology, (2) Research Using Biological Collections, and (3) National Plant Genome Initiative (NPGI) Postdoctoral Research Fellowships.” <<more>>

**National Science Foundation Dynamics of  
Coupled Natural and Human Systems Program**

Deadline: November 21, 2017

Dynamic of Couple Natural and Human Systems Programs “supports interdisciplinary research that examines human and natural system processes and the complex interactions among human and natural systems at diverse scales. Research projects to be supported by CNH must include analyses of four different components: (1) the dynamics of a natural system; (2) the dynamics of a human system; (3) the processes through which the natural system affects the human system; and (4) the processes through which the human system affects the natural system.” <<more>>

**American Council of Learned Societies** is introducing “a new set of ACLS Project Development Grants, in connection with their Fellowships, for projects from faculty at teaching-intensive institutions. Applicants from these institutions who are not selected for fellowships but present particularly promising proposals may be awarded a grant of \$5,000 to help advance

their projects.” The FAQ indicates that baccalaureate colleges, community colleges, and regional comprehensive institutions are included in the ACLS's definition of “teaching-intensive institutions.” <<more>>
